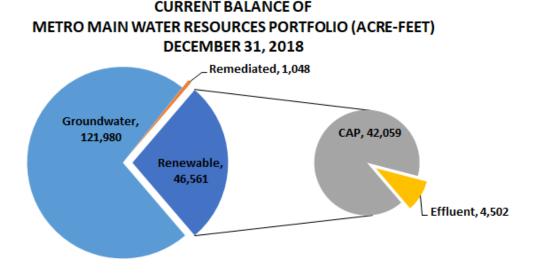
#### **Water Sustainability Projects**

**2019 CAP Storage** – Deliveries of City of Phoenix water started on January 1, 2019. As of May a total of 3,233 acre-feet (AF) of water has been delivered to AVRP. In July, the District's water will be delivered for the balance of the calendar year. A total of 1,515 AF of the District's water order has been delivered to our groundwater savings facility partners.

**South Shannon Treatment System Reimbursements** – Since 2000, \$1,224,408.42 has been reimbursed from Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ). For Fiscal Year 2019, ADEQ has a budget of \$55,888 for operations and sampling of the South Shannon Treatment System. With the South Shannon well down for maintenance, the District has only consumed 50% of ADEQ's budget. An invoice for the month of April has been submitted for reimbursement.

**Avra Valley Recharge Project** – A technical design report and a description of the work to be performed on the AVRP facility is being prepared by Staff for submittal to ADWR for a Director's modification to the current permit. Design work is continuing for the civil engineering improvements planned for the AVRP facility. Construction work on the facility's improvements is anticipated to occur in Fiscal Year 2020 between January and June of 2020. These improvements, when completed, are projected to bring the operational recharge capacity up to or near the 11,000 AF permit capacity.

**Water Resources Portfolio** – Metro Main's water portfolio increased by 4 percent as of December 31, 2018. All categories of water increased with the exception of Remediated water, which is held constant at the capacity of the South Shannon treatment system. The District's portfolio increased by 6,421 AF of CAP long term storage (LTS) credits, 264 AF of Recycled water LTS credits and a 274 AF increase in the allowable groundwater account.



The 2018 value of renewable supplies is ~\$9.5 million, which is an increase of approximately \$1 million from 2017.

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Lost and unaccounted for water in Metro Main and Metro Hub in 2018 was 2% of produced water. Metro Southwest averaged 3.5 percent lost and unaccounted for water in calendar year 2018.

### **Capital Improvement Program & Other Major Projects**

RTA Waterline Relocation – La Cholla Blvd: Overton Road to Lambert Lane – Project closeout with the contractor is complete.

The Town of Oro Valley's roadway contractor is proceeding with adjustments and the removal of waterlines necessitated by the RTA roadway improvement as authorized by the Intergovernmental Agreement executed in April 2019. These efforts will continue into Fiscal Year 2020.

**Northwest Recharge, Recovery, and Delivery System (NWRRDS)** – Easement acquisition is ongoing. The following summarizes the status of immediate possession as approved by the Board:

- APN 216-31-0380: The final order of condemnation has been received from the court and this case is concluded.
- APN 216-32-025A and 216-32-028A: Legal counsel is continuing to prepare the case for hearing, which is anticipated later in 2019.

Requests for quotes for exploration well drilling, as well as clearing and grubbing activities related to the access road, were submitted to Job Order contractors using the District's cooperative purchasing agreement with the City of Tucson. The field work for the native plant inventory and assessment within District property east of the Marana Regional Airport (airport access) was completed. Meetings with the NWRRDS Partners were held on May 9 and May 29, 2019. A technical team meeting was held May 21, 2019.

**Hub Reservoir Expansion** – Construction and commissioning of the new tank is complete; electrical installation and final site work is ongoing. All other site work is expected to be completed by mid-June 2019.

**Old Nogales Highway Mainline Replacement** – Staff continued coordination with Pima County regarding execution strategies. Review of contractor submittals and coordination with the apparent low-bidder regarding related modifications to the plans continued.
