- 4. Completed well maintenance at Tucson National East and Alcott Wells.
- 5. Placed Magee La Cholla north storage tank back in service following internal coating.

Water Sustainability Projects

South Shannon Treatment System Reimbursements – Since 2000, \$1,144,282.90 has been reimbursed from Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ). The April 2017 reimbursement invoice has been submitted to ADEQ.

Oracle Jaynes Replacement Well – OJ2 well testing has been completed. The new source water quality sampling was conducted on May 23rd and all pumping tests are finalized. The technical memorandum with the step test analysis from Clear Creek Associates was submitted to Metro staff on June 25th. Preliminary plans for site grading and enclosure are being finalized for construction. The preliminary design for well equipping and electrical is almost finalized and equipment for pump installation has been ordered.

CAGRD Long Term Storage Credit (LTSC) Transfer - The credit transfer form for 250 acre-feet of effluent credits will be submitted to CAGRD for signature in July. Per the IGA, the 2017 purchase rate is \$182.58. Total revenues from credit transfer will be \$45,645.00.

Capital Improvement Program & Other Major Projects

RTA Waterline Relocation – La Cholla Blvd: Overton Road to Lambert Lane – Staff is continuing their design work while coordinating with Pima County/Oro Valley and their design consultant. Stage IV (pre-final) roadway improvement plans are expected from the County's/Oro Valley's design consultant in late May with final design by late June 2017.

RTA Waterline Relocation -- Valencia Road: Wade Road to Ajo Highway, Waterline Relocations - Staff have initiated design work while coordinating with Pima County and their design consultant. "Final for Utilities" roadway plans were issued in early May. Pima County is requesting all relocation work to be completed by December 2017.

Northwest Recharge, Recovery, and Delivery System (NWRRDS) Land Acquisitions – Staff continues to pursue easements necessary for the pipeline route. Information has been provided to the Arizona State Land Department to aide in their review.
