Water Sustainability Projects

2022 CAP Storage – The District has ordered 9,960 acre-feet of its allocation to be delivered to groundwater savings facility (GSF) partners in 2022 with the remaining 3,500 acre-feet of the District's allocation delivered to CAP for use in the 500 Plus Plan as additional system conservation beyond what the DCP requires of the state. The District will be compensated at a rate of \$260.61 per acre-foot, which totals \$912,135.00. The City of Phoenix has ordered 3,500 acre-feet of CAP water to be delivered to AVRP in 2022. Deliveries began in June after facility improvements were completed. Approximately 100 acre-feet of Phoenix's water was delivered in June.

South Shannon Treatment System Reimbursements – Since 2000, \$1,489,295.83 has been reimbursed by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ). For Fiscal Year 2022, ADEQ has a budget of \$61,234 for operations and sampling, and \$43,260 for two GAC changeouts of the South Shannon Treatment System. The invoice for June 2022 will be submitted in mid-June.

Capital Improvement Program & Other Major Projects

Northwest Recharge, Recovery, and Delivery System (NWRRDS)

Staff and the District's consultants continue finalizing efforts to obtain the various permits and authorizations required for close-out of the design phase.

The Arizona State Land Department issued the temporary construction easement that will enable an intermediate jacking pit, which is expected to reduce the duration of monitoring required by Union Pacific Railroad during jacking operations.

NWRRDS (Metro-only portion)

Work continued on the Landscape and Native Plant Mitigation Plan to satisfy a requirement by Pima County. Work commenced for the remaining cultural and environmental studies required to enable the review and permitting of the NWRRDS Independent Boosters and the independent transmission mains west of Twin Peaks under MOA 2022-01_00 OV. This work is anticipated to be completed within the next 90 days.

Staff is continuing work to phase the Metro Independent pipeline to facilitate separate construction projects.

Two applications were submitted for consideration by WIFA. Staff is completing the various loan documents and supporting information.

E&T22 Well Replacement – Land acquisition activities are ongoing. An application was submitted to WIFA for consideration. Staff is completing the various loan documents and supporting information.

Ironwood Well Site Acquisition – Land acquisition activities are ongoing. It is anticipated that the Marana Unified School District Board will consider the item at their August 11, 2022 meeting.

AVRP Upgrades – Construction is complete and operation of the new improvements commenced on June 27, 2022.

Skyline Ranchos Mainline Replacement – Construction of the new waterline is complete.
