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System Maintenance

Noteworthy Maintenance Projects and Major Repairs in July 2024:

- 1. Staff assisted with the Burton Drive shutdown for the galvanized line abandonment.
- 2. The special inspection for the Alcott block wall occurred on August 6, 2024, and the District's contractor is addressing identified items.
- 3. The warehouse roof seal and recoat has been completed as part of the Fiscal Year 2025 Investments to Support the District Mission.
- 4. Staff has been working to replace 4,000-meter lids as part of the AMI project.
- 5. Staff has been removing trees and fixing damaged fences throughout the District from storm damage.

Water Sustainability Projects

2024 CAP Storage –All of the District's 8,460 acre-feet of ordered CAP water will be delivered in 2024 to groundwater savings facilities (GSF). As of the end of June, 4,986 acre-feet of the District's order has been delivered to the CMID and Kai Farms Red Rock GSFs.

The City of Phoenix's revised order is for 5,000 acre-feet of CAP water to be delivered to AVRP in 2024. As of the end of June, 3,141 acre-feet of Phoenix's order has been delivered to AVRP.

South Shannon Treatment System Reimbursements – Since 2000, \$1,681,095.58 has been reimbursed by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ). In Fiscal Year 2024, the South Shannon treatment system pumped 112 million gallons and removed 11.66 pounds of VOCs from the aquifer. A GAC change out was performed on the treatment system in June. The well pump was pulled and maintenance work is anticipated to be completed by mid-August.

Capital Improvement Program & Other Major Projects

Northwest Recharge, Recovery, and Delivery System (NWRRDS) (Partnered portion) The Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR) was authorized to proceed with GMP-01 through GMP-05. The remaining GMP-06 for the realigned portion of the transmission main is under design by District staff. Staff received comments from the Partners for the proposed realignment and is proceeding with the next stage of design. Borderland continued installation of the pipeline along Avra Valley Road east of the Marana Regional Airport with two separate crews. The Establishment of Just Compensation for the easements within the TGI I-10 Land Partnership parcels was signed by the District and returned to Tierra Right-of-Way, and is pending adjustment based on a new legal description to accommodate the redesign.

NWRRDS (Metro-only portion) The contractor is working on Phase 3 along Linda Vista. The work is 90% complete.

Ironwood Well – Carollo Engineers was given notice to proceed on July 11, 2024 to begin electrical and security design work.

Burton Drive – The pipeline installation is complete. The project replaced approximately 1,400 feet of 2" steel pipeline.

Rose Marie Lane – Staff is continuing with preliminary design activities and is preparing documents for solicitation. This project is anticipated to replace approximately 600 feet of 2" galvanized pipeline.
