

Metro Hub Meter Replacement

As a reminder to all customers in the Metro Hub service areas, the Sensus iPerl meters that use a magnetic read technology are in the process of being replaced with a Badger positive displacement meter that mechanically measures water usage. Letters were sent to all customers in the Metro Hub service areas.



Meters are being replaced by Metering
Services, Inc. (MSI) staff who will have identification, they will be wearing
uniforms and driving vehicles with the MSI company logo. All work will be
completed outside of your house. Water could be turned off for up to 30
minutes while the work is being completed and MSI's staff will attempt to
notify you prior to shutting off your water. Meter replacement work will
be performed Monday through Friday, 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.

OFFICE UNDER CONSTRUCTION

OC vacancies were announced in the Spring 2020 Splash Newsletter to seek District residents who would be willing to volunteer their time to serve on the Committee. We received responses from not just one but three qualified members of the District who volunteered to serve on the FOC.

Mr. Bugental possesses a Bachelor of Arts in Politics and has accomplished additional education to include a certificate program in general accounting and has previously served on water commissions and boards. Dr. Krempen possesses both a Bachelor of Science and a Master's Degree in Business Administration and is a Medical Doctor with expertise in immunology and infectious diseases. Ms. Wnuk possesses both a Bachelor of Science and a Master's Degree in Chemistry as well as a Master's degree in Civil and Environmental Engineering and has extensive experience in water and wastewater.

The traditionally seven member Committee has recently gone through some changes with members having to resign for different reasons. As of March 2020, members of the Committee were Lee Jacobs, Lee Mayes, Scott Schladweiler, Robert Shonka and Kip Volpe. The three new members temporarily increase the Committee to eight.

ORACLE ROAD PROJECT

As part of the District's capital improvement program, our contractor will be relocating or removing water lines in and along Oracle Road, generally between Ina Road and Orange Grove Road.

The project will relocate water lines to accomodate the roadway shoulder improvements along Oracle Road.

Construction is expected to begin in August 2020, and is anticipated to be completed by December 31, 2020.

SPOTLIGHT ON METRO SOUTHWEST



The District's Diablo Village Well No. 1. experienced a submersible motor failure at the end of June. Not an ideal situation with the summer demand: however, the District was able to utilize its other well and emergency interconnects to maintain service to customers. Since the submersible motor is located in the bottom of the well, the well pumping equipment had to be removed. The District took this opportunity to perform additional maintenance and inspection of the well which included brushing the well casing and video inspections of the well. This type of maintenance enhances the longevity of the well. Pictured is Smyth Industries, the District's well maintenance contractor, reinstalling the new motor. After reinstalling the new motor, the well was thoroughly flushed to remove any sediment, disinfected, and sampled to ensure the water was safe prior to returning to service.

DID YOU KNOW...

The District knows how much water each customer uses with what is called a "meter". This device is placed along the service line extending from the water main to the line where the water enters a home (typically at the property line), and records the volume of water that passes through it. Readings are taken each month to determine how much water


