Meter Upsize Fees

Fees for upsizing a meter for added capacity include the Meter Fee for the new meter, plus the difference in the Water Resources Fees and the difference in the System Development Fees between the current smaller meter and the larger meter desired, as listed in the current Water Service Connection Fees schedule published on the Metro Water District website.

Note: Upsizing a meter assumes the water service line feeding the meter has been confirmed to be at least as large as the new size meter desired. Installation of a larger water service line will be required if a service line is smaller than the new meter size desired. All additional costs for installation of the larger water service (if necessary), as well as reconnection of the private system, will be the customer's responsibility.

Meter Downsize Fees

Fees for downsizing a meter include the Meter Fee listed for the new meter size published at the same link above, for the materials and labor on the new replacement meter.
